What does United Way do?

United Way for South Louisiana helps bring people and resources to address the growing needs of families and individuals in our community.

USWLA is a non-profit organization that is independently managed by volunteers from Assumption, St. Mary, Lafourche, and Terrebonne Parishes. We provide funding to partner agencies that provide local critical health and human services needs, as well as assist in disaster relief.

We at United Way for South Louisiana believe that we must be **responsive to the needs of everyone in our community** who may receive services, regardless of their racial/ethnic background. Our Board of Directors, volunteers, and staff strive to be an organization that **values people of all backgrounds** and aim to treat everyone with **respect, integrity, and honesty**.

Our mission is to be recognized as the best caring choice for donors and to provide financial support for local health and human service agencies benefiting our people.

How is money distributed?

Our Board of Trustees and Funds Distribution Committee, made up of local volunteers, review grant applications from 22 nonprofit agencies, monitor programs, and allocate the funding each year. All decisions are made locally and 100% of the dollars raised stays here.*

Mary Bird Perkins in Houma - Focuses on the medically underserved, providing education for prevention and early detection of cancer through free screenings. It also provides nutritional counseling, medication assistance and transportation for cancer patients. (985) 850-6307
